



# GORTON CAMPMASTER CORPS

## TEAM REGISTRATION INFORMATION

The Gorton Campmaster Corps is a group of dedicated, experienced, and trained Scouters (adult Scout Leaders) who volunteer to promote year-round Scout camping at our council camps, specifically Camp Gorton. The Campmaster Corps is comprised of teams, each with a team leader, who serve during weekend camping to aid Scout units.

### Campmaster Team Size:

Each Campmaster team should consist of three to six Scouters. Large teams allow for greater scheduling flexibility. The entire team is welcome, but not needed for weekend service. However, three team members are needed in order to serve on a particular weekend.

### Campmaster Team Duties:

1. Coordinate with Camp Gorton Ranger to Check-In/Check-Out camping units. (*Guide*)
2. During the course of the weekend, offer Scout-skill demonstrations or programs and encourage Scout, patrol, and unit participation. (*Inspire*)
3. Coordinate with Camp Gorton Ranger to identify and complete camp service projects. (*Serve*)

### Time Requirements:

- Each team is asked to serve two to three weekends each year.
- Campmaster teams will serve during the spring, autumn, and winter camping seasons.
- Campmaster teams report by 5:00PM on Friday evening and will serve through 1:00PM on Sunday of the scheduled weekend.
- Each team member will need to attend one or more orientation/training weekends prior to service.

### Qualifications:

- Each team member must be currently registered with the Boy Scouts of America. Registration may be in Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Venturing or District/Council positions.
- Team Members should not currently be serving as a Cubmaster, Scoutmaster or Venturing Crew Advisor (a primary unit leader's focus should be with the unit). All other leadership positions are welcomed and encouraged.
- All team members must have a current BSA Youth Protection Training certificate.
- Each team member is encouraged to have current CPR and Standard First Aid certification. Regardless, of those members reporting for weekend service, at least one member must have these certifications.
- Each team member must complete a Campmaster Corps orientation weekend prior to service.

### Fees:

There is no fee to join the Gorton Campmaster Corps; however, all meals during weekend service are the responsibility of team members.
