Commitment to Outdoor Program

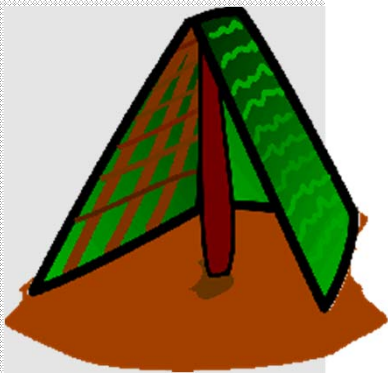


- 14 Youth and 6 Adults on Camp Gorton Staff

Dedicated Service

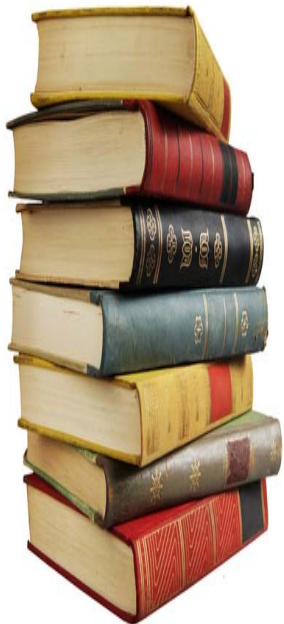


- Wineglass Marathon: 9 members provided a total of 45 hours of service helping to clean up the roadway from Bath to Painted Post

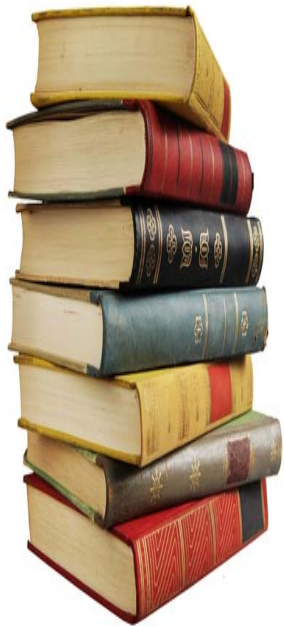

Journey To Excellence Performance



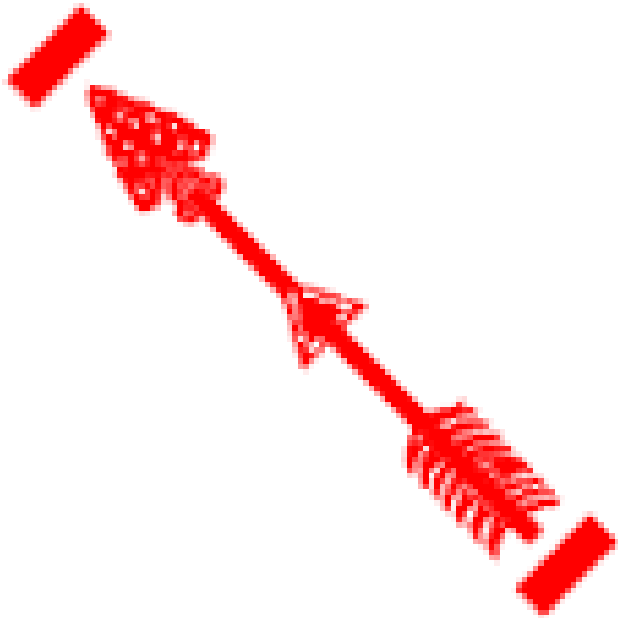
- Achieved Bronze Level Status in 2016
