Guidelines and Regulations for Pack Outings



In Cub Scouting there are several ways in which Scouts can enjoy the outdoors. This form explains each of these opportunities paying special attention to leadership requirements, training needed, Scout/Leader ratios and forms to be filed with the Council Service Center. If you have any questions please feel free to contact your District Training or Camping Chair.

These guidelines provide a safe atmosphere for, what may be, our Scouts first outing. Lets all work together to safely keep the outing in Scouting. Together, we can deliver the promise of Cub Scouting - **See you at the Campground!**

Please Note: This form explains the regulations for individual Pack outings and does not reflect regulations for District or Council Cub Scout camping programs (including Day Camp and Resident Camp).

Pack Overnights:

These are pack-organized events focused on age-appropriate activities (including events for siblings if appropriate), and must be conducted on council-approved locations (approved site list available on our website).



- All Cub Scouts can attend including Tiger Cubs and a one to one parent/Scout ratio is recommended. In any case every youth participant, Scout or sibling, is responsible to a specific adult. We recommend that no adult be responsible for more than four children.
- Adults giving leadership to a pack overnighiter must have completed **Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)** and Youth Protection Training and be present on the outing.
- A Local Tour Permit must be filed with and approved by the Council Service Center.

Webelos Den Overnights:

Webelos den overnights introduce a Webelos Scout and his parent to the basics of the Boy Scout camping program. When conducted by a den (absent a Boy Scout Troop) the following guidelines apply:



- Webelos Scouts, their parents and leaders are the only members of a Cub Scout Pack that can attend these events.
- A one to one parent/Scout ratio is recommended. In any case each Webelos Scouts is responsible to a specific adult. We recommend that no adult be responsible for more than four children.
- Adults giving leadership to a Webelos Den overnighiter must be Trained Webelos Den Leaders having completed Youth Protection Training as well as Webelos Leader Outdoor Training. In addition, the leader holding the appropriate training certifications must be present on the outing.
- A Local Tour Permit must be filed with and approved by the Council Service Center.

Family Camping:

Only specific **Council-Organized** *Family Camping* is covered by insurance.
