What does it cost to attend NYLT?

The Fees to attend NYLT is the same for both courses, however, there are time deadlines. The FULL fee is \$200.00, paid after the dates below, but Scouts can reduce the cost by \$25.00.

- Pay \$175.00 by Wednesday, January 15th for the Winter Course- (Two Weekend Course)
- Pay \$175.00 by Friday, July 11th for the Summer Course- (Weeklong Course)

What does the fees include?

The fees include course materials, meals, snacks, T-shirt, water bottle, and use of the camp facilities.

Can the Troop or Crew pay for youth to attend NYLT?

The Troop or Crew Committee is not obligated to pay for a youth's training course, *BUT think about this!* When your Scout returns from NYLT, you'll notice how much this training has helped him or her both personally & for the unit. Many Troops and Crews feel it is a great investment in the units youth leadership. Some units re-pay half of the cost to the Scout after they have completed the training course.

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What is NYLT?

NYLT is a leadership course developed by the Boy Scouts of America to enable Scouting youth to lead their units. NYLT uses the methods of Scouting to teach leadership skills. A week is spent in an environment that exemplifies the “best” that Scouting can be and is the vision that Baden-Powell intended. Youth will experience a “Boy led Troop” as the program is run by youth.

The Five Rivers Council employs the national program to deliver two NYLT Courses. One is split up into two weekends in the winter at Camp Gorton. And a week long course in the Summer at Camp Brule’. Each Course is limited to 48 participants to maintain the quality of the program.

NYLT participants must be at least thirteen years of age and First Class Rank or Venturers who are 14-17 years old and be in a position of leadership, or who will be candidates in the near future. A Scout must want to attend NYLT and have the enthusiasm and desire to participate in this learning experience. Because NYLT requires camping skills, it is recommended Scouts have had at least one long-term camp experience (such as summer camp) in order to attend.

Venturers age 18-21 years of age are encouraged to attend Wood Badge for the 21st Century.

What is the NYLT Program?

The NYLT course simulates a month in the life of a Troop in a six-day course (two weekends in the winter and 1 week in the summer). It reinforces and expands upon Be-Know-Do leadership. Scouts learn a number of leadership skills and concepts. The Scouts learn about the stages of team development and how to match the most appropriate leadership style with the developmental stage of the individual or team. The course has many challenges for the youths, including its culmination where they undergo a quest for the meaning of leadership.

The NYLT course has Eight Key Elements

- A month in the Life of a Troop
- Four stages of Team Development
- Leadership requires Vision, Goals, and Plans
- Toolbox of Leadership Skills
- Consistent Leadership Modeling
- Scout Oat and Law
- Fun!!
- Traditions

What will Scouts Learn?

The Scouts come away from their NYLT experience with exposure to the best of the best of leadership techniques. They will learn many valuable skills about how to create a vision of success, how to set goals and make plans, how to listen and solve problems, and how to teach and lead. Most of all, they learn the bigger picture of how to put the needs of others first in order to be a truly great leader. They learn to use the Scout Oath and Law to make hard decisions and to remain true to Scouting’s values.

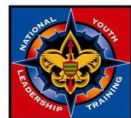
