# What to Bring To Camp

Tent to Sleep in  
Scout Uniform  
Sleeping bag blanket and pillow  
Sleeping Pad  
Comfortable walking / hiking shoes and sneakers  
Underwear (shirt & shorts) & socks  
Extra clothing (shorts, pants, shirts)  
Cap or hat & cool weather jacket  
Flashlight with extra bulb and batteries  
Canteen / water bottle  
Rain gear  
Bath / hand towel, wash cloth, and shower shoes  
Soap & shampoo  
Toothbrush & toothpaste  
Brush / comb  
Spending money for trading post, souvenirs, etc.

## Items to leave at Home

Fireworks, ammunition, guns, bows, sheath knives, camouflage and military clothing, valuables, bicycles, pets, radio, electronic mp3/music players, motorized or remote controlled toys, personal CB radios, youth cell phones, and aerosol cans of any type.
