

Spring Into Scouting

Spring Into Scouting is designed to be an overnight camping experience to educate Webelos and new Scouts on the basic skills needed to have an enjoyable camping experience. In a controlled environment, Scouts can become comfortable and familiar with future camping experiences as they continue their journey with Scouts BSA. This is an excellent opportunity for Scouts nervous about camping, Girls interested in joining Scouts BSA, and first year Scouts with little experience.

If you are not available to stay overnight, come for the day on Saturday!

Who can attend? While Scouting is for the whole family, this event is designed to help prepare Arrow of Lights and new Scouts for the Scouts BSA camping experience. Registration is intended for prospective and new Scouts BSA Scouts of all ages, Arrow of Light Scouts, Unit Leaders, and parents.

What if my Pack or Troop is not attending? That is OK! Families are welcome to attend separate from their Packs and Troops. Individual Scouts, however, need supervision. Families are more than welcome to come camp and learn together.

My friend may want to join Scouts, can I bring them?

Absolutely! Spring into Scouting is a wonderful opportunity to educate potential Scouts about the Scouts BSA program. Prospective girls and boys new to Scouting alike are more than welcome to attend and register to join Scouting. We ask that no Scout comes unsupervised and that a parent or guardian camps with them.

What will we do? Get the crash course in camping all in one weekend! Learn about first aid, essential knots, fire starting, tent selection and set up, basic camping and backpacking equipment, and more!

What will we eat? Smores and snacks will be provided for those staying overnight on Friday. Please be sure to bring a stick for your Marshmallows! Breakfast on Saturday morning will be cooked at Camp Sites. Ensure that your Scout or Unit has a meal prepared and the appropriate cooking materials. For suggestions or questions, contact the Event Chair or Staff Advisor. Lunch on Saturday will be provided.

What do I need to bring? Participants should bring a tent, a weather appropriate sleeping bag or blankets, a flashlight, a mess kit & eating utensil, food for breakfast at your own camp site, a water bottle, rain gear, boots, and marsh mellow stick for the Campfire Friday night. If you have any questions or concerns regarding equipment, please contact the Event Chair or Staff Advisor.

What should I leave at home? Fireworks, ammunition, guns, bows, sheath knives, alcohol, camouflage and military clothing, valuables, bicycles, pets, radio, electronic mp3/music players, motorized or remote-controlled toys, personal CB radios, youth cell phones, and aerosol cans of any type.

Special Needs and Dietary Restrictions?

Youth or adults who have special needs due to physical or mental challenges will be accommodated to the best of our ability. Please be sure to let the Scout Service Center know as soon as possible of any special needs.

Those with special dietary needs will be accommodated to the best of our abilities. Specific written needs for each camper with allergies are required prior to arrival at camp.
