Safety Afloat	Packs Limited to Non-Flowing Current!							Required for ANY Troop or Crew Activity!								
Climb On Safely	Not Applicable for Cub Scout Packs!							Required for ANY Troop or Crew Activity!								
<b>LEADER SUPPLEMENTAL TRAINING AT THE LOCAL DISTRICT/COUNCIL LEVEL</b>																
Merit Badge Counselor	Required to be a Merit Badge Counselor whether a registered BSA leader or not.															
Monthly Roundtable	Program support provided by each District. Required number for training knots.															
Chartered Org. Rep.	Training related to the partnership of an organization & Scouting and the responsibilities of the organization in support of the sponsored unit or units.															
District Committee	Training for the District Committee positions of: Key 3; Committee Operations, Membership, Finance, Training, Camping, Advancement, Activities.															
Commissioner Basic	Specific training for UC, ADC and DC with a focus of unit service. Liaison of the District.															
<b>LEADER SUPPLEMENTAL TRAINING AT THE LOCAL COUNCIL LEVEL</b>																
Pow Wow	For Cub Scout Leaders. One day event with 6 hands-on sessions of program specific support.															
Univ. of Scouting	Multiple levels of official and unofficial training and informational sessions for all leaders.															
Leave No Trace	Formal program offered at University of Scouting.															
Trainer Development	Conducted for individuals to acquire or hone training techniques and presentation skills.															
Project C.O.P.E.	Offered via Crew 801 in support of the COPE Course at Camp Brule'.															
<b>LEADER TRAINING AT THE COUNCIL LEVEL WITH REGIONAL APPROVAL</b>																
Commissioner Science	Training event where the focus is of a degree nature to acquire a Bachelor, Masters or Doctorial Degree in the field of commissioner service															
Wood Badge	Universal training. Highest level of training. Leadership skill based for all program levels.															
Powder Horn	Specific training for Crew and Troop leaders related to High Adventure Activities.															
<b>REGIONAL AND NATIONAL TRAINING</b>																
Nat. Camping School	Key summer camp staff positions require BSA certification. Day Camps and Resident Camps.															
Camp Visitation Spec.	Recommended individuals attend a one day training seminar and return to the local council to train others as well as conduct local camp inspections.															
Philmont Trn. Ctr.	A multitude of official and unofficial programs offered throughout the summer.															
<b>OFFICIAL YOUTH TRAINING</b>																
Den Chief	Training at District/Council level for Boy Scout youth fulfilling Cub or Webelos Den Chief roles for a Pack.															
NYLT	NYLT (National Youth Leadership Training) is conducted for Scouts first class and above to learn how to be a more effective leader in their troop															
Venturing Ldr. Skills	Conducted by the unit, district or council for Crew Officers - Youth Leaders.															
OA Troop Rep.	Conducted by the Order of the Arrow for individuals representing the O/A to their Troop.
